
Why the Arts are Essential to Community Development



As of 2016, among PA's 18 cities with a population of 20,000 or more, Bethlehem:

- Has the highest median household income
- Has the lowest poverty rate
- Is one of five that have gained population since 1980
- Ranks first in residential property value
- Has the lowest residential vacancy rate

What the Arts have done for Lancaster

Mayor Rick Gray came to office in 2006, with an agenda focusing on the arts. He created "Lancaster Public Art", a program within the Mayor's office. Lancaster has experienced an incredible jump in attracting creative young people.
